A WARM HOME FOR THOSE WHO LOST THEIRS

In a **SHELTER IN THE DNIPROPETROVSK REGION**, more than 70 evacuated Ukrainians live permanently, while around 20 more stay here temporarily each month. These are people who have lost their homes, survived occupation or captivity, or lost loved ones. They can no longer return to their homes.

In the shelter, those who have lost everything receive a roof over their heads, food, and essential supplies to help them start over. But that's not all — the team also supports their social integration, document recovery, job search, and adaptation to a new life.

Last year, we helped install a heating boiler in one of the shelter's two houses and purchased wood pellets. This year, we have installed a second boiler, stocked up on pellets for the entire winter, provided an EcoFlow power station and fuel for the generator in case of power outages, a water heater, warm clothing, and blankets.

The shelter residents will now sleep in warm beds, stay connected with their loved ones, drink tea, take hot showers, and spend time together in warmth.

Your €70 donation ensures that one resident stays warm and doesn't have to fear the cold.



GENERATORS FOR PEOPLE LEFT WITHOUT ELECTRICITY DUE TO SHELLING

Our partner organization in Ukraine has purchased and delivered 23 power generators:

- 3 were sent to "Points of Invincibility" in the Pokrovsk district of te Donetsk region
- 20 were distributed among street leaders in frontline villages and towns of the Donetsk region to be given to residents in need.

Thanks to these generators, people in these settlements will have access to clean water from wells, hot meals, warmth, and the ability to charge their phones to stay in touch with loved ones.

In the photo is Liubov Yakivna from Hryshyne village, 83 years old. She worked as a postal worker her whole life and now lives alone in retirement. Thanks to your support, Lyubov Yakivna won't freeze — she'll have hot tea and warm soup.

Your £12 donation provides warmth, a charged phone, and a hot meal for a Ukrainian left without electricity due to shelling.

COAL FOR FAMILIES LEFT WITHOUT A MEANS OF SURVIVAL

Our Ukrainian partners received requests from 210 families in frontline areas of the Donetsk region. Most residents here have lost their jobs and cannot afford to heat their homes. The team delivered 10 bags of coal to each family.

In the photo is Nina Mykolaevna from Dobropillia, 69 years old. She worked her whole life at a local hospital and is now retired. She has no close relatives to take care of her — but she has us.

LIGHT, WARMTH, AND HOT MEALS FOR A MOTHER, GRANDMOTHER, AND EIGHT CHILDREN — AND MORE

We prepared TWO SHELTERS IN ZAPORIZHZHIA REGION and a FAMILY-STYLE CHILDREN'S HOME evacuated from Myrnohrad to Dnipro for the winter. The shelters have become home to over 50 people, while the children's home houses a mother, grandmother, and eight children — all evacuated from the Donetsk region and Berdiansk. The shelters had only recently opened and lacked essentials for a comfortable life. Thanks to your support, we changed that. Now, every family has a powerful power bank — no one fears losing connection.

No resident will be left in darkness — large, portable lanterns now light up the spaces. People won't lose touch with loved ones—these lanterns can charge phones and small devices. Every resident will have hot meals—thermal containers keep food warm even during power outages.

At the family-style children's home, there will be light and warmth all winter: 2 gas heaters, 8 gas canisters, lanterns, and power banks for emergency blackouts.

Your **€129** donation provides electricity, warmth, and care for one resident.

ARM AND PEACEFUL WINTER FOR 60 PEOPLE.





WARMTH, LIGHT, AND SAFETY FOR AN ENTIRE NEIGHBORHOOD

This winter, the city of Kostiantynivka in the Donetsk region has no heating at all. But there are **POINTS OF INVINCIBILITY** — heated shelters where people can take cover from shelling. These spaces play a crucial role during the cold months, often serving the same residents from nearby areas.

These shelters are heated using solid fuel boilers, but the community cannot keep them running all winter on their own. We helped purchase and deliver 15 tons of biomass briquettes for one Point of Invincibility. This will be enough to keep it warm until the end of winter.

Now, residents of Kostiantynivka will always have a place to warm up, charge their phones, boil water for tea, and cook meals. They can even stay overnight if they feel it's too dangerous to remain at home.

Your €3 means safety and comfort for a Ukrainian left without electricity and heating due to the shelling.

WARMTH FOR PEOPLE IN DAMAGED HOMES AND FOR STUDENTS IN A COLD SCHOOL

Our Ukrainian partners collected requests for 42 wood-burning stoves from three de-occupied villages in the Kherson region.

In Novohryhorivske, large families, pensioners, and people whose homes were destroyed are in need. Many had to leave their homes in other parts of the Kherson region due to the frontline's proximity or occupation. We helped purchase and deliver 30 stoves for them so they can stay warm this winter.

In Tomyna Balka, stoves were critical for those whose homes were damaged by shelling or occupation. We sent them 10 stoves so those affected could make it through the winter.

In Mykhailivka, there is a school with 58 children. Thanks to your support, they now have two stoves, so students can learn in a warm classroom.

Your €143 donation provides a wood-burning stove that will keep a family of four warm all winter.



HEATING FOR ADULTS, CHILDREN, AND PETS

Another shelter we were able to provide with warmth is in Dnipro. It welcomes people with animals, which is a rare exception. Many Ukrainians hesitate to leave their homes, even in danger, because they don't want to part with their pets. Most shelters are unable to accommodate both people and animals, but this one in Dnipro does.

Currently, 35 people live there — 25 adults and 10 children. Alongside them, 23 dogs and 2 cats have found refuge. The shelter also serves as a temporary home for around 10 people each month. When we met its manager, there was only a week's worth of heating materials left. Thanks to your donations, we were able to provide 50 cubic meters of briquettes. This will keep adults, children, dogs, and cats warm and together through the rest of the cold season.

WARMTH FOR GRANDPARENTS, PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES, AND ANIMALS WITH NOWHERE ELSE TO GO

Another **SHELTER IN ZAPORIZHZHIA** consists of three private houses converted into a space for internally displaced people and their pets. It is home to 43 people, including 19 pensioners and 15 people with disabilities. The shelter has also taken in 13 animals. Every month, another 12 to 15 people find temporary refuge here — mostly evacuees from the Donetsk and Zaporizhzhia regions who had to flee due to the advancing frontline or occupation.

Since the shelter was established, not a single elderly resident has been taken in by their relatives, even if they have family. For many, elderly people became a burden. Without this shelter, they would have nowhere to go.

Thanks to your donations, we were able to provide 30 cubic meters of firewood — 10 cubic meters for each house. Grandparents, people with disabilities, and their pets will spend this winter in warmth.

Your €42 means a warm winter for an elderly or mobility-impaired person.
