EVACUATION OF ELDERLY PEOPLE FROM OCCUPIED AND FRONTLINE TERRITORIES

These funds will be used to transport 10 people with limited mobility and fully immobile ones from settlements in the occupied territories (sometimes from hard-to-reach villages where shelling occurs daily). The sum includes: payment for the curator of the limited mobility department, payment for medical transportation, train tickets, caregiver services, accommodation, wheelchairs, food, communication, and medications.



SHELTER IN DNIPRO: 120 PEOPLE

The organization conducts evacuations of people from the frontline territories, managing to evacuate 50+ individuals weekly (from Kharkiv, Donetsk, and Luhansk regions). The evacuated people are accommodated in a shelter. Monthly, the shelter houses 80-100 people, with the majority being permanent residents.

TWO SHELTERS FOR 50 PEOPLE IN THE DNIPROPETROVSK REGION

The shelter accommodates people who have lost their homes, survived occupation/captivity, or lost loved ones. They are assisted in restoring documents and undergoing social adaptation.

The organization regularly needs help with rent and utilities payments, as well as providing those affected with food, medications, and other essentials.

HUMANITARIAN AID FOR 360 PEOPLE

Providing targeted help in villages that were previously under occupation and those located in frontline territories. Volunteers visit these villages monthly and bring humanitarian aid to the residents.

PURCHASE OF BROOMS, BASINS, AND FOOD FOR 50 DOGS AT A SHELTER IN KHARKIV

The shelter permanently houses around 400 dogs and 100 cats brought from across the region, including animals abandoned from liberated territories. Many of them have suffered from shelling, are in a stressful condition, and require veterinary care. The shelter faces a budget deficit for food and expendable materials. In March, the shelter reported the need for brooms for cleaning, basins for feeding dogs, and cat litter.

RENT FEE FOR A MEAL PREPARATION SPACE FOR THOSE AFFECTED BY SHELLING, RESCUERS, AND VOLUNTEERS

The charitable organization prepares over 700 meals daily in Kharkiv. The meals are delivered to volunteers who are involved in building restoration and to people in frontline territories. Additionally, the organization goes to locations where missiles have hit to feed those affected and rescuers. The ingredients for the meals are donated by international organizations and companies in Ukraine. The foundation needs a space for meal preparation that meets all standards.

FAMILY FROM ODESA

On March 2, a Russian drone destroyed a residential multi-story building in Odesa. Tetiana and her son survived, but their apartment is completely destroyed. We have already helped the family by purchasing essential items and remain in contact to provide further assistance.

EVERY LITTLE BIT HELPS (1807)

PURCHASE OF GENERATORS AFTER SHELLING OF UKRAINE'S ENERGY SYSTEMS IN MARCH

After mass rocket and drone attacks, around 1.5 million residents in Ukraine were left without electricity. We delivered 15 generators to Kharkiv, Dnipro, Zaporizhzhia, as well as to the Dnipropetrovsk and Donetsk regions. In the coming days, another 3 generators will be sent to Kharkiv, which is experiencing constant shelling.

FAMILY FROM VELYKA PYSARIVKA
