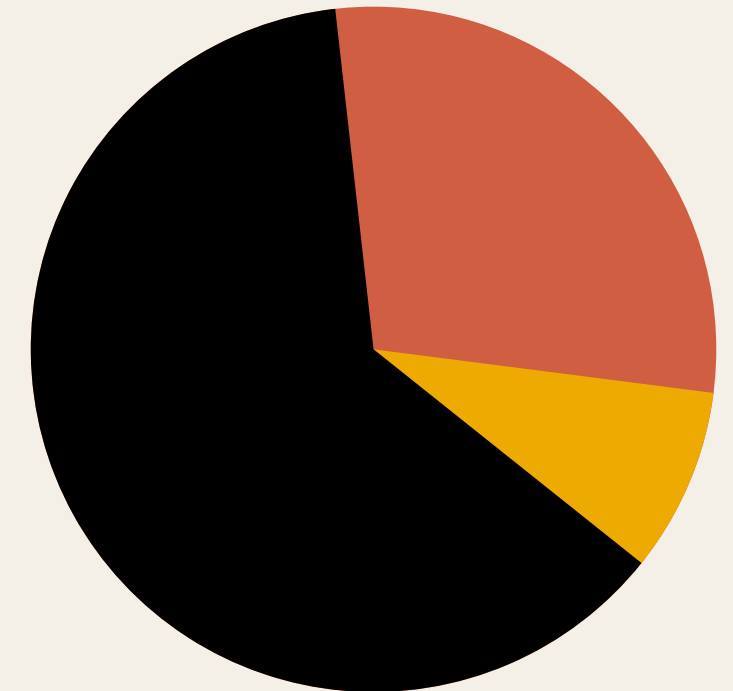

# EMERGENCY AID IN DNIPRO €2,000

Our Dnipro partners head to strike sites immediately after attacks and continue working there for several days afterward. In March, the team made 7 such trips.

The team provided hot meals and tea to more than 315 people, and offered psychological support to 48 others. After one of the strikes, our partners delivered 310 liters of water to emergency service workers.

The team also repaired blown-out windows in 28 apartments and 3 building entrances — installing and fixing more than 88 windows in total.

The team's current priority is restocking essential supplies: water, fuel, and protective film for damaged windows. Your donations make it possible to purchase these supplies and provide stable support to people in the critical hours after strikes.

# EMERGENCY AID IN KRYVVI RIH

€1,300

In March, we continued working with our new partners — a rapid response team from Kryvyi Rih. The group consists of several dozen people who support local residents in the hours immediately following Russian attacks. In March, the team responded to strikes approximately 20 times.

The volunteers clear debris, seal damaged windows and doors, and prepare buildings for repair work. The team members have also completed first aid training and provide care to those injured in attacks.

Your donations allowed us to repair the vehicle the team uses to reach strike sites and purchase fuel for it. We also launched a separate fundraiser to support the team on an ongoing basis.

# DELIVERY OF HOT MEALS TO PEOPLE AFFECTED BY SHELLING

€6,000

Our Kharkiv partners — the **ROKSANA AND THE TEAM** foundation — responded to 9 strike sites in March and prepared and delivered:

- 1,500 hot meals to a shelter housing evacuated people with limited mobility
- 3,200 hot meals, 7,000 sandwiches, drinks, and sweets to evacuation centers in Kharkiv
- 1,200 hot meals, milk, bread, and fruit to residents with limited mobility in frontline areas of the region
- 5,000 hot meals, 17,000 sandwiches, sweets, and drinks to survivors, rescue workers, and volunteers at strike sites in Kharkiv and the surrounding region
- 700 hot meals, sandwiches, fruit, and sweets to evacuated children with and without disabilities from Donetsk region

Together with you, we keep the foundation running steadily: your donations allow the team to buy food and disposable tableware each month and cover the rent for their kitchen space.

# SUPPORT FOR SHELTERS IN DNIPRO

€4,000

Nadiia and her three children — 8-year-old Veronika, 6-year-old Danylka, and 5-year-old Kyra — were traveling home along the highway to Pokrovsk. Many people are, on the contrary, trying to leave this city because of constant strikes. Police officers and volunteers stopped Nadiia and her children and brought them to safety — to our partners at **CHILDREN NEW GENERATION**, who in turn place evacuees in two of their shelters. One is a permanent residence; the other, designed for mothers with children, is a transitional shelter. That is where Nadiia and her children are staying now.

In March, 108 people and their pets were evacuated from frontline areas of Dnipropetrovsk, Donetsk, and Zaporizhzhia regions. Some of them were placed with CNG. The main shelter currently houses 64 people, and the mother-and-child shelter houses 84.

Your donations help the team evacuate people quickly and provide housing and support to families in critical situations.

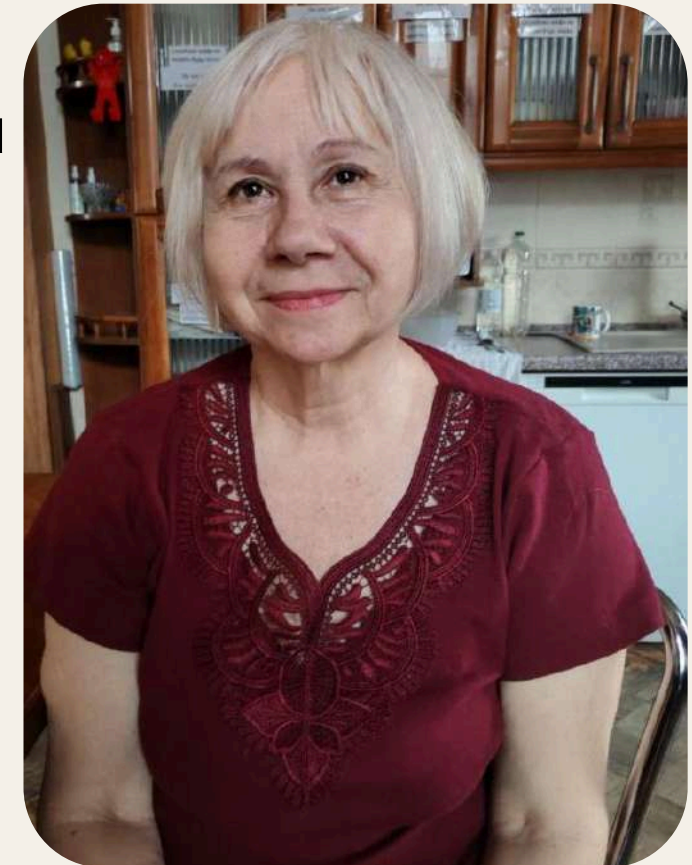

# SUPPORT FOR A SHELTER FOR PEOPLE WITH LIMITED MOBILITY €4,007

69-year-old Iryna from Druzhkivka in Donetsk region cares alone for her son, who became disabled after an accident and requires constant support. In 2022, Iryna and her son were evacuated to Volyn and later to Lutsk, but eventually returned home. In autumn 2025, fighting again drew closer to Druzhkivka, and in February the family decided to evacuate again.

After leaving, they were first sent to Kramatorsk, then to Lozova. There, attempts were made to admit her son to a psychiatric facility. Iryna refused and insisted on not being separated from him. She reached out to our partners for help, and with their support the family was placed in a shelter and later found separate housing.

Our partner organization helps people with special needs who have been forced to leave dangerous regions. The team organizes their departure, accompanies them along the way, provides temporary housing, and helps them find a new, more stable place to live. With your support, in March they were able to help 18 people.

# SUPPORT FOR A SHELTER IN THE DNIPROPETROVSK REGION

Pictured is Andrii Spirydonovych from Krasnyi Lyman. In 2022, a strike hit his apartment and destroyed all of his belongings. In 2026, he was caught in another attack — and lost an arm and a leg. He also lost his documents in the strike. He was evacuated to Sloviansk for treatment and rehabilitation, then transferred to a shelter run by our partners, the **MOTIVATION TO LIVE** foundation, where Andrii is receiving help to restore his documents and is being cared for.

In March, your donations provided shelter residents with a roof over their heads, food, and care — and also allowed the team to:

- Arrange medical consultations for newly arrived residents with limited mobility
- Take shelter residents to the cinema
- Purchase walkers for elderly residents
- Organize rehabilitation specialist visits twice a week
- Prepare the garden next to the building for planting vegetables

We also launched a major fundraiser to help Andrii Spirydonovych and others who have lost their documents because of the war.

# SUPPORT FOR A SHELTER FOR IDPs AND MOTHERS WITH CHILDREN IN KAMIANSKE

€1,585

Tetiana is originally from Henichesk in Kherson region. After the full-scale invasion began, she moved to Dnipro — but unfortunately could not escape the war there either.

During one of the strikes on Dnipro in 2024, a shell hit the building where Tetiana lived. To save herself, she had to jump from the fourth floor. She went through a long period of treatment and rehabilitation before ending up in a shelter run by our partners in the city of Kamianske.

The organization welcomes a wide range of people who have lost their homes because of the war. Around 40 people live in the shelter permanently, and several others stay temporarily. Unfortunately, the team has very limited resources and, without our help, cannot cover even the most basic needs.

In March, we purchased a month's worth of food for the shelter and paid for cosmetic repairs to the first floor to address a mold problem.

# DELIVERY OF PET FOOD TO UKRAINE

€3,000

Halyna from Kryvyi Rih cares for 58 animals: 39 dogs and 19 cats. All of them were rescued from the streets and depend entirely on human help. Halyna provides them with food and basic care, while we and you together supply food and care products.

A volunteer initiative from Stockholm collects the food, and we organize its delivery to Ukraine. In March, we managed to deliver 3,000 kg of pet food to Kharkiv, Dnipropetrovsk, Donetsk, Zaporizhzhia, Mykolaiv, Odesa, and other regions.

# PADS, MEDICATIONS, VACCINES, AND WINDOWS FOR A PET SHELTER IN KHARKIV

€3,055

The eight kittens in the photo were brought to the **KHARKIV CITY PET SHELTER** by soldiers who evacuated them from an active combat zone in Donetsk region. The kittens are approximately 2 months old and are still a little frightened. The shelter's veterinarians are examining and caring for each one so that they will soon be ready to go to new homes.

In March, the Kharkiv City Shelter took in 88 dogs and 44 cats. Veterinarians sterilized 178 animals, and 134 dogs and cats found new homes or were placed under the care of civic organizations. The shelter is currently caring for 479 animals. Your donations covered veterinary supplies, vaccines, and diapers for them.

In the early hours of March 5, the shelter came under fire. The strike blew out the building's windows, caused the ceiling to crumble, shattered light fixtures, and damaged the roof. Fortunately, the animals were not physically harmed — though they experienced severe stress. We helped our partners replace the damaged windows.

# FOOD, CAT LITTER, AND RENT FOR A SHELTER FOR EVACUATED CATS AND DOGS €3,520

The cat in the photo is named Britani. Our Kharkiv partners at **ANIMAL GUARDIANS** rescued her from Pechenyhy in Kharkiv region. She had spent the past two years living in a doghouse on the street. Britani once had a family, but at the start of the full-scale war her owners left and abandoned her. During her time without a home, she passed through several caretakers before eventually ending up in a doghouse. Our partners brought her to Kharkiv, treated her, helped her adjust behaviorally, and found her a new home. Britani now has a loving family. The organization's shelter houses 140 cats and 13 dogs. Thanks to you, in March the team managed to:

- Purchase food, litter, and household supplies
- Pay rent, utilities, and the salary of the staff member who monitors and cares for the animals
- Purchase medications and cover veterinary treatment costs

Yana and her family are internally displaced persons from Pokrovsk district in Donetsk region. The family owned a home there, which was destroyed by the war. They are now renting an apartment in a small town in Dnipropetrovsk region.

Yana lives with her two children (aged 15 and 9) and her parents, who also lost their home to Russian attacks. She works as a teacher, and her salary barely covers basic living expenses. Despite support from her husband, who lives separately, Yana is unable to meet all of her family's needs.

We sent the family money to purchase clothing, footwear, and medications.

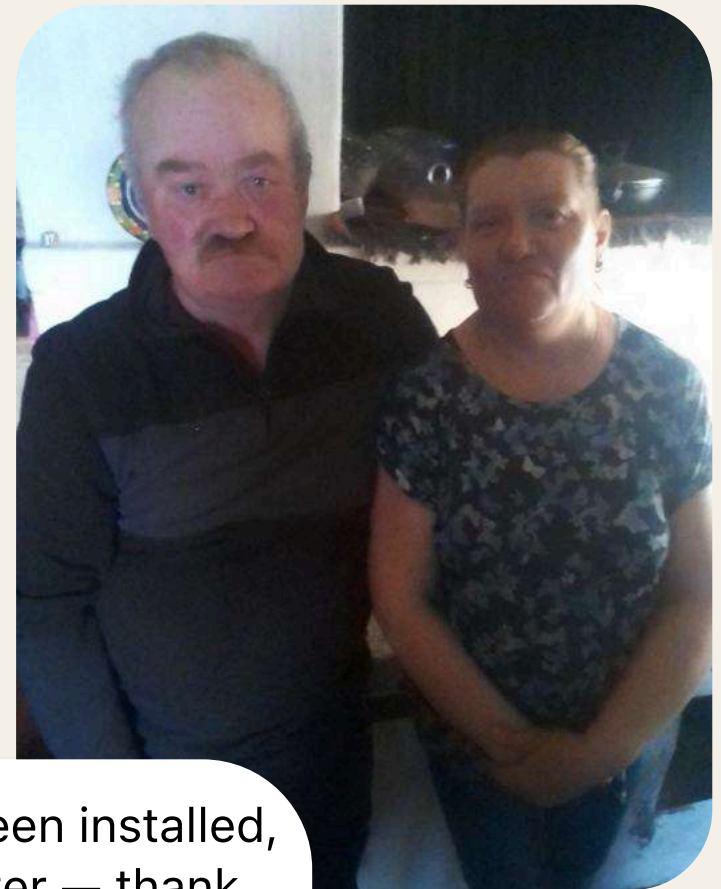
# IRYNA AND MYKOLA'S FAMILY FROM THE DNIPROPETROSK REGION

Iryna and her husband Mykola are retired internally displaced persons from Donetsk region. They now live in a village in Dnipropetrovsk region, renting a small house that they heat with firewood. Unfortunately, they had no access to drinking water — there is a well on the property, but no pump to draw water from it. Iryna and Mykola had to regularly carry water from their neighbors.

The family's only income is Mykola's small pension. Their daughter lives separately with her own family and is unable to support her parents, as her family also went through evacuation and is trying to rebuild their lives from scratch.

We helped Iryna and Mykola purchase a pump so they always have access to drinking water, a phone to stay in touch with family, and clothing.



The pump has been installed, we now have water — thank you so much for your help
