EMERGENCY AID IN KYIV

€10,000

As a result of a massive Russian strike on Kyiv on May 24, hundreds of apartments and private houses were destroyed, and several educational and medical facilities were damaged. Our new partners — Kateryna Terekhova's volunteer group — are helping to clear the aftermath. They deploy to sites of destruction immediately after rescue operations end to tidy up damaged apartments. Volunteers board up blown-out windows and doors with OSB panels and film, clear away glass and debris, and organize the living space so that people can stay there until full repairs are made or they move elsewhere.

Thanks to your support, we were able to quickly pay for the necessary materials directly at the "Epicentr" construction hypermarket, and volunteers received them within hours of the shelling.

EMERGENCY AID IN KRYVYI RIH

€690

In May, we once again supported the work of the rapid response team in Kryvyi Rih. It consists of several dozen people who assist local residents in the initial hours following Russian attacks: they clear rubble, board up blown-out windows and doors, and prepare homes for repair work. Additionally, these young people assist emergency responders; the team has undergone first aid training for this purpose.

Thanks to your donations in May, we were able to purchase fuel for the team's work vehicle, which allowed them to deploy to strike sites six times. We have also launched a separate fundraiser to continue supporting the team and the affected residents of Kryvyi Rih:

HOT FOOD DELIVERY FOR PEOPLE AFFECTED BY SHELLING

€5,000

Our Kharkiv partners — the **ROKSANA AND THE TEAM** foundation — continued to feed people at the sites of Russian shelling throughout May.

In that month alone, there were **77** strikes in Kharkiv. Our partners deployed personally to 11 of these locations and provided food and drinks for the others — a total of **3,000** hot meals, **15,000** sandwiches, 2 pallets of water, sweets, and fruit for victims, rescuers, and volunteers. Additionally, they regularly prepare hot meals for a shelter for people with limited mobility (700 portions), feed people evacuated from the Donetsk region (1,850 portions), and deploy with field kitchens to strike sites in the Kharkiv region.

Together, we ensure the foundation's stable operation: with your donations, the team purchases groceries and disposable tableware every month and pays the rent for their cooking facility.

SUPPORT FOR SHELTERS IN DNIPRO €4,000

Oleksandr is raising his young daughter, Aryna, on his own: her mother was stripped of her parental rights. He, his daughter, and Oleksandr's father evacuated from Sloviansk in the Donetsk region. In recent months, shelling of the city has significantly increased: Aryna began reacting to the explosions and air raid sirens, so her father decided not to take any more risks. The family is currently staying in a shelter for mothers and children, where they are preparing to move abroad so that the child can grow up in safety and have a peaceful childhood.

In May, the **CHILDREN NEW GENERATION** foundation continued to support people who were forced to flee their homes due to the war. Currently, 64 people reside permanently in the main shelter, while the transit hub for families with children took in 46 displaced persons from the Donetsk and Dnipropetrovsk regions over the month. Here, people receive temporary housing, a chance to regain their strength after what they have endured, and the necessary support before the next stage of their lives.

Your donations help ensure the uninterrupted operation of the shelters: paying utility bills, purchasing household goods, and maintaining comfortable and safe conditions for people who are currently in particular need of help.

HELP TO A SHELTER FOR PEOPLE WITH LIMITED MOBILITY €3,000

Olena lived in the village of Pysarivka, Kharkiv region, together with her husband, mother, daughter, and grandson. The family did not want to leave their home and farm until the very last moment, but due to increasing shelling, they were forced to evacuate. The most difficult part was evacuating two family members who use wheelchairs, which is why the decision to leave was particularly hard for them. Volunteers evacuated the family early in the morning, despite the threat of drone attacks, and brought them to a shelter. Now the family is safe, receiving the necessary support, and preparing to move into rented housing after processing financial assistance. Gradually, they are recovering from their experience and getting used to life without the constant threat of shelling.

This month, our partners helped provide safe temporary housing for 14 people with limited mobility. The team accompanies families at every stage — from placement in a shelter and medical assistance to finding more stable living conditions. All of this is possible thanks to your support.

HELP TO A SHELTER IN THE DNIPROPETROVSK REGION €6,030

Before the start of the full-scale war, Viktor Valeriiovych lived in Pokrovsk with his wife and child and worked as a miner. When the situation in the city became too dangerous, they decided to leave. Unfortunately, during the evacuation, their car was attacked by two drones. His wife and child died on the spot, and Viktor was seriously injured. The military managed to evacuate him to Petropavlivka, and from there to Dnipro. He spent three and a half months in the hospital and another month living in his own car near the hospital. When the social services found out about this, our partners from the organization **MOTIVATION TO LIVE** took Viktor into their shelter. Now they are helping him restore his documents and stabilize his psychological state.

In May, your donations provided food and care for the shelter's residents, enabling the team to take in new people — including those with amputations — and organize the provision of prosthetics for them. Additionally, your support made it possible to replace the old wiring and purchase a large supply of hygiene products. Apart from that, we were able to send our partners the first part of the money collected for the restoration of the residents' documents.

SUPPORT FOR AN IDP AND MOTHERS-WITH-CHILDREN SHELTER IN KAMIANSKIE

€1,750

The photo shows Yaroslav; he is 16 years old. Together with his mother Maryna and younger brother Denys, the boy has been living in our partners' shelter in the city of Kamianske, Dnipropetrovsk region, for four months now. The family left Shakhtarske: Maryna could no longer endure the constant shelling and took the boys to a safer place. Here, they have the opportunity to take a breath and figure out how to build their lives moving forward.

The shelter welcomes a wide variety of people who have lost their homes due to the war. About 40 people live here permanently, and several others find temporary refuge. Unfortunately, the team has very few resources, and without our help, they are unable to cover even the most basic needs of the residents.

In May, we purchased food for the shelter for the following month. We also paid for the replacement of a freezer and a sofa in the children's room.

VETERINARY MEDICATIONS AND SUPPLIES FOR THE SHELTER IN KHARKIV

€3,090

The photo shows puppies that soldiers found in a locked, abandoned house in Ruska Lozova, Kharkiv region, and brought to our partners — the **KHARKIV CITY PET SHELTER**. The little ones were in a de-occupied territory where almost no one remains except the military — all the roads there are under constant drone fire. How they ended up there is unknown. Our partners examined the puppies, provided necessary treatments, and have already found new families for them!

In May, the Kharkiv shelter took in 97 dogs and 75 cats. Veterinarians sterilized 144 animals, while 163 found new homes or were transferred to the care of public organizations. Currently, the shelter is caring for 449 animals. Your donations provided them with veterinary medications, surgical supplies, and products for cleaning the enclosures.

FOOD, CAT LITTER, AND RENT FOR A SHELTER FOR EVACUATED PETS €2,700

The photo shows a cat named Manyasha, a ward of our partners from Kharkiv — the organization **ANIMAL GUARDIANS**. She was found on the city streets in a state of extreme exhaustion and could barely move. Based on her medical examinations, Manyasha was diagnosed with infectious peritonitis, heart disease, and a chest injury; it appears someone had hit the cat. She received treatment at a clinic, and now her condition is stable and she has moved to our partners' shelter. The organization's shelter is home to 140 cats and 13 dogs. Thanks to you, in May the team was able to:

- purchase food, cat litter, and household supplies;
- pay the rent, utilities, and the salary of the staff member who cares for the animals;
- purchase medications and pay for the pets' medical treatment.

DELIVERY OF PET FOOD TO UKRAINE

€4,000

Olena and her husband care for more than 85 cats and 5 dogs in the Cherkasy region: they run a small home shelter. They feed and care for the animals, treating and sterilizing them whenever possible, and also feed stray cats and dogs in the surrounding area. Due to the large number of animals, they are constantly in need of food, which our partners were able to help with in May.

The food is collected by a volunteer initiative from Stockholm, and we organize its delivery to Ukraine. In May, we managed to deliver 4 tons of food and other pet supplies to the Kharkiv, Dnipropetrovsk, Donetsk, Zaporizhzhia, Mykolaiv, Odesa, and other regions.

NATALIIA AND A FAMILY OF DISPLACED PERSONS FROM SHAKHTARSKE €2,664

In early February, a Russian strike destroyed a three-story building in the city of Shakhtarske, Dnipropetrovsk region. A family of seven displaced persons and a pensioner, Nataliia, with her dog, were left without a home. All members of the large family suffered severe burns and need rehabilitation, while Nataliia is temporarily living with a friend because her apartment was completely destroyed.

We opened a fundraiser for housing rent, recovery from injuries, and basic necessities for these people, and in May, we were able to send the victims the first part of the money collected. The fundraiser is ongoing; you can support it at the link:

OLHA'S FAMILY FROM TERNOPIL

€450

Olha and her two children, aged 11 and 12, live in rented housing in Ternopil. In 2015, they left their home in Donetsk for Volnovakha, but in March 2022, they had to flee from there as well. The family evacuated urgently, only managing to take their documents; the children were in pajamas and boots without socks.

Olha works in the civil service. Her husband lives in Chortkiv, Ternopil region: he managed to find a job there as a railway worker, and whenever possible, he visits the family and helps financially. The relatives of Olha and her husband are in the temporarily occupied territories.

We sent the family money to purchase power banks, blankets and pillows for the children, bed linen, kitchenware, and other household items to make their daily life a bit more comfortable.

ALEVTYNA'S FAMILY FROM THE KHARKIV REGION

€523

Alevtyna Afanasiivna (79 years old) lives in the city of Chuhuiv, Kharkiv region, together with her daughter and 15 animals that they helped evacuate in the past.

In 2022, their house was damaged by shelling: a blast wave knocked down a 17-meter tree, which fell and destroyed the roof of their home. The women covered it with plastic sheeting, but over time it tore, and now rain and snow leak into the house.

We sent the family money for a temporary waterproof roof covering and also put them in touch with our partners — the Kharkiv City Pet Shelter — to help them with veterinary consultations and medical treatment for the animals.

DARIA'S FAMILY FROM NIKOPOL €2,000

The home of Daria and her parents in Nikopol has been subjected to Russian shelling three times. After the first strikes, the family repaired the damaged part of the house on their own, but new attacks ultimately destroyed the residence. The latest shelling on April 6 damaged the house so severely that it is beyond repair.

Fortunately, at the time of the strike, the entire family was at work and was not harmed. Now Daria and her parents are renting a house in another district of Nikopol. Thanks to your support, we were able to help the family with their rent so they have a safe place while they try to start their lives anew.

YULIA'S FAMILY FROM DNIPRO

Yulia and her children — a 3-year-old daughter and an 8-year-old son — live in Dnipro. On the night of April 25, they came under fire in their own home: the blast wave cracked their plastic window frames and blew out the glass. Fortunately, the family managed to run away from the windows into the hallway and was not harmed.

Yulia is raising the children alone and can only rely on her aunt's help. Unfortunately, the women do not have the money to replace the windows. We sent the family funds for this purpose.

SUPPORT FOR SVITLANA FROM DNIPRO

€2,000

Svitlana's apartment in Dnipro was destroyed during the same shelling on April 25: load-bearing structures were damaged, walls were destroyed, and windows and doors were blown out. The home was declared uninhabitable. Her car, which was parked near the house, burned down. During the strike, Svitalana managed to get down to the basement and miraculously escaped serious injury.

After the shelling, Svitalana temporarily moved in with a friend, but there is no possibility of staying there long-term. Thanks to your support, we were able to transfer funds to her for renting a home, so she has a place where she can begin rebuilding her life.
