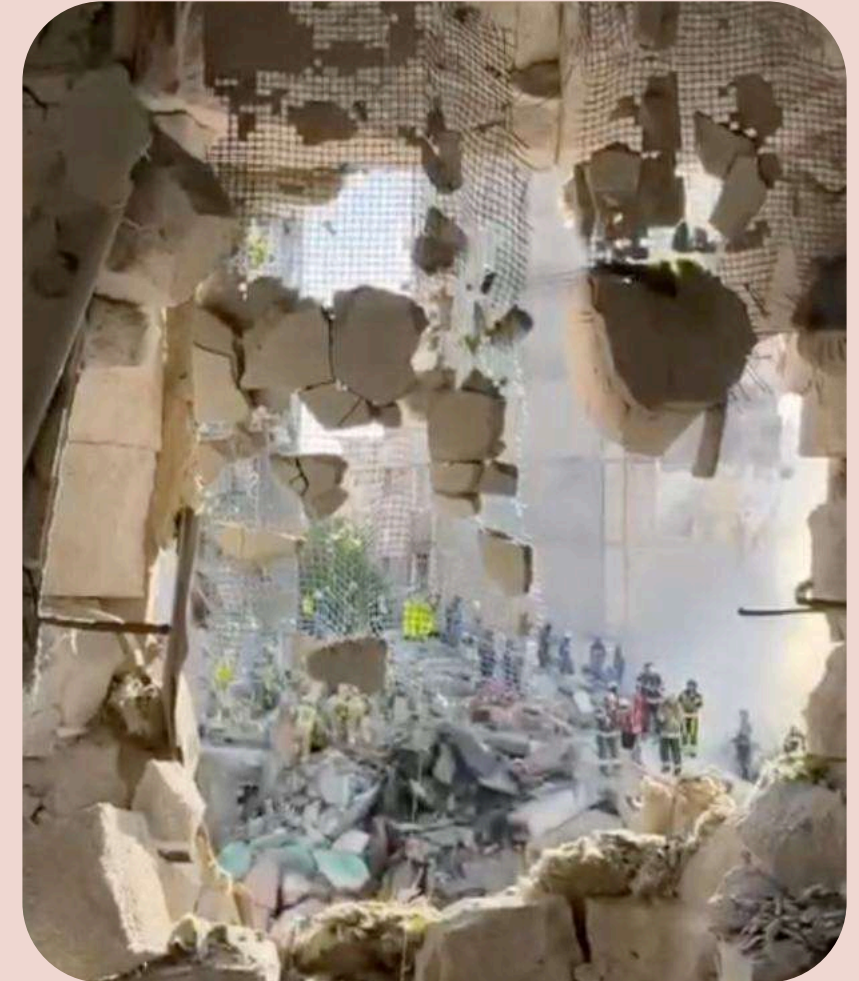

EMERGENCY AID IN KYIV

€3,000

In June, the Russian army continued its massive shelling of Kyiv with ballistic missiles and strike drones, while we continued to support Kyiv residents. Our partners established a mobile humanitarian group in the capital of Ukraine that deploys to shelling sites, provides first aid, evacuates the wounded, the elderly, and people with limited mobility, and helps them contact relatives or reach hospitals and temporary housing.

The team has two ambulances, medical equipment, trained volunteers, and official access to rescue sites. Thanks to your support, we sent them funds to purchase protective gear, first aid kits, radios, flashlights, stretchers, and medical supplies, enabling the volunteers to help people quickly and safely following Russian attacks.

EMERGENCY AID IN KRYVYI RIH

In June, we once again supported the work of our regular partners in Kryvyi Rih — a rapid response group. It consists of several dozen people who help local residents in the first hours after Russian attacks: they clear debris, board up shattered windows and doors, and prepare homes for repair work. In addition, these young people assist emergency responders; the team has undergone first aid training for this purpose.

Thanks to your donations in June, we were able to purchase fuel for the group's work vehicle — this allowed them to deploy to shelling sites about 15 times and provide assistance to approximately 50 people. We have also opened a separate fundraiser to continue supporting the team and the affected residents of Kryvyi Rih:

HOT FOOD DELIVERY FOR PEOPLE AFFECTED BY SHELLING

Our Kharkiv partners — the **ROKSANA AND THE TEAM** foundation — continued to feed people at the sites of Russian shelling in June. During the month, there were 114 strikes in Kharkiv alone; our partners personally deployed to 23 of them and provided food and drinks for victims, rescuers, and volunteers for the rest. Additionally, the partners regularly prepare hot meals for a shelter for people with limited mobility (**1,560** portions), feed people evacuated from the Donetsk region (**3,300** portions), displaced children and children with disabilities (**2,255** portions), and deploy field kitchens to shelling sites in the Kharkiv region. In total, the team prepared **49,700** portions of hot meals for those in need over the course of the month.

Unfortunately, on June 28, a warehouse where our partners stored supplies of grains, pasta, sugar, milk, and disposable tableware burned down during a shelling attack. None of the staff members were injured, but the entire contents of the warehouse were destroyed. We promptly sent the foundation funds to purchase new food supplies and to pay the rent for the kitchen facilities.

HELP TO A SHELTER IN THE DNIPROPETROVSK REGION €6,500

The photo shows Eduard from the city of Marhanets, Dnipropetrovsk region. He worked his whole life as a molder at an ore repair plant in his hometown. Before the full-scale invasion, he lost his mother and moved to the village of Ilinka in the Donetsk region. There, due to difficult life circumstances and poor living conditions, he suffered severe hypothermia, which led to the amputation of his finger phalanges. After treatment, Eduard was sent to a distribution center for internally displaced persons; there, he learned about our partners' shelter — the organization **MOTIVATION TO LIVE**. He received a roof over his head and the necessary medical and psychological assistance. In June, your donations provided food and care for the shelter's residents and allowed the team to:

- hold several art therapy sessions for the residents;
- organize a visit from a mobile medical team to check the residents' health;
- arrange temporary residency registration for people so they could apply for government benefits;
- take in new people after evacuations and hospital stays, including those with amputations and without documents (the fundraiser for document restoration is ongoing; support it at the link:)

VETERINARY MEDICATIONS FOR THE **€2,500** TREATMENT FOR A PET SHELTER IN KHARKIV

The photo shows a young cat who spent more than a week on a high ledge of a building in Kharkiv because he couldn't get down on his own. The residents of the building fed him, hoping he would come down himself, but when they realized the situation was becoming critical, they turned to the Department of Emergency Situations for help. Their staff rescued the animal and brought him to the **KHARKIV CITY PET SHELTER**. Currently, the cat is undergoing rehabilitation after severe stress and will soon be ready to find a new family.

In June, the Kharkiv shelter took in 78 dogs and 54 cats. Veterinarians sterilized 150 animals, while 157 found a new home or were transferred to the care of public organizations. The shelter is currently caring for 420 animals. Your donations provided the veterinary medications for their treatment and parasite prevention.

FOOD, CAT LITTER, AND RENT FOR A SHELTER FOR EVACUATED PETS €3,000

The photo shows a cat named Cashew, who was found on the outskirts of Kharkiv. After the death of his owner, he wandered the streets with three dogs until our partners — the organization **ANIMAL GUARDIANS** — learned about him and took him to their shelter. Keshenka, as they affectionately call him, was taken to a veterinarian for an examination, check-up, and neutering. The little one was severely emaciated and weighed only 2.5 kilograms. Fortunately, he stayed at the shelter for only a very short time: a young woman named Liliia noticed him and took him home. Now Cashew is doing well, living in a loving home with two other cats.



In total, the organization's shelter is home to 139 cats and 13 dogs. Thanks to you, in June the team was able to:

- purchase food, cat litter, and household supplies;
- pay the rent, utilities, and the salary of the staff member who cares for the animals;
- purchase medications and pay for the pets' medical treatment.

HELP TO A SHELTER FOR PEOPLE WITH LIMITED MOBILITY €3,000

77-year-old Natalia Serhiivna lived in Vovchansk, Kharkiv region, and later moved to stay with an acquaintance in the village of Varvarivka, Zaporizhzhia region. Despite the lack of electricity and gas, they managed the household, looked after the home, and supported each other. Six months ago, the homeowner passed away, leaving the woman alone as shelling intensified. The deceased man's son reached the village by tractor, helped her pack her most essential belongings, and evacuated Natalia Serhiivna to Kharkiv. The dangerous journey took nearly five hours.

On April 24, Natalia Serhiivna was brought to our partners' shelter, where she is gradually recovering from her experience. The shelter staff are helping her restore her documents and resume her pension payments, while also attending to her health and searching for permanent housing.

Thanks to your support, elderly people and those with limited mobility receive safe temporary housing and accompaniment on their journey toward a more stable life. In June, our partners were able to provide temporary housing for 13 people with limited mobility.

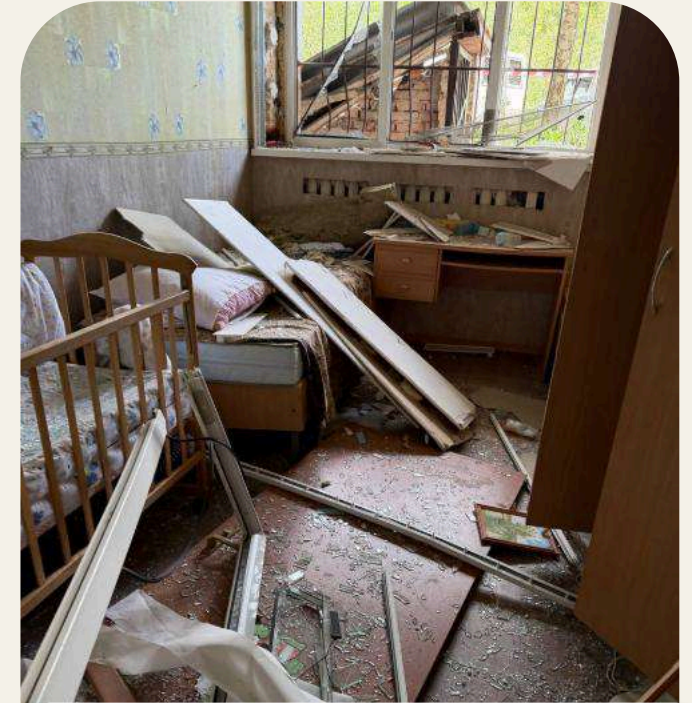
WINDOW REPLACEMENT AT THE MOTHER AND CHILD CENTER IN SUMY €4,300

On June 27, Russian drones damaged the building of our partners — **THE MOTHER AND CHILD CENTER IN SUMY.**

Two mothers and one-and-a-half-month-old twins were injured during the shelling: shards of shattered window glass fell into their cribs. The babies and mothers were immediately taken to a local hospital, where they received medical treatment. Now they are all doing well and have nearly recovered from the attack.

Due to the attack, no intact windows remained in the center — the staff had to temporarily cover them with OSB boards.

We opened a fundraiser and sent the center funds to replace 13 windows so that women and children who have nowhere else to go can continue living there.

EVACUATION OF PEOPLE FROM OCCUPIED TERRITORIES

Artem (name changed) is 21 years old; he is originally from occupied Melitopol, Zaporizhzhia region. The young man set fire to a Russian flag, for which he served a year in prison. After his release, our partners managed to evacuate Artem from the occupation, bypassing checkpoints and filtration via a special route with a trusted driver.

Our partner organization evacuates people from the temporarily occupied territories of Ukraine — after evacuation, they are sent to areas controlled by Ukraine or to the EU. In June, your donations helped evacuate five people from the occupied territories: the funds covered transportation, the preparation of travel documents, the team's work, and food and medicine for the evacuees.

HELP TO A SHELTER FOR IDPS AND MOTHERS WITH CHILDREN IN KAMIANSKIE €1,570

The photo shows Artem; he is 46 years old, from Pavlohrad, and he has no relatives. Two months ago, a Russian shell landed near his house. He was injured and taken to a hospital in Dnipro, where he learned about our partners' shelter. He has been living there for a month and a half now.

The shelter in the city of Kamianske, Dnipropetrovsk region, welcomes a wide variety of people who have lost their homes due to the war. About 40 people live here permanently, and several others find temporary refuge. Unfortunately, the team has very few resources, and without our help, they are unable to cover even the most basic needs of the residents.

In June, we purchased food for the shelter for the following month and fuel for the generator.

LIUBOV'S FAMILY FROM ZAPORIZHZHIA

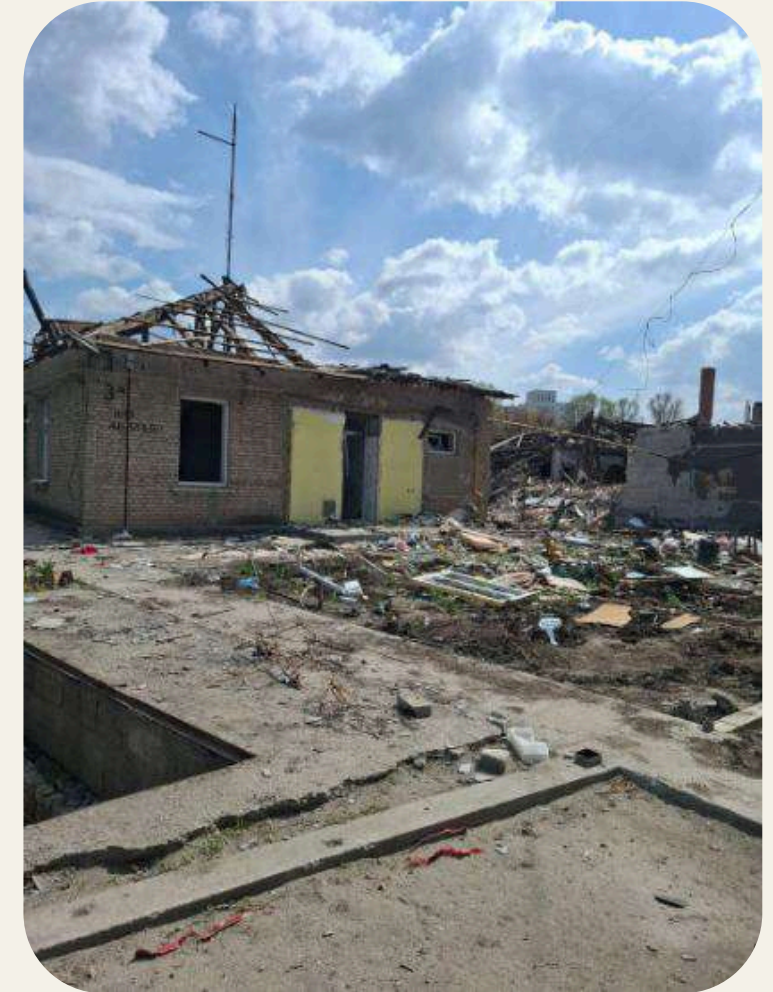

On March 14, an aerial bomb completely destroyed Liubov Orlovska's home in Zaporizhzhia. Liubov herself, her 16-year-old daughter, her student son, her retired mother, and her 73-year-old aunt, who has had a disability since childhood, lived in the house.

The family had purchased the home only a few years ago. After the strike, almost nothing of the building was left, and the family was left with housing debts and destroyed belongings. Liubov and her relatives were forced to rent part of a one-room apartment, which they shared with the landlady.

Thanks to your support, we raised money for the family to rent a new home and to buy essentials, medications, clothing, and household appliances.

Valentyna, her husband, and their three children (aged 11, 9, and 6) live in Ternivka, Dnipropetrovsk region. Her husband works in a mine rescue unit. Valentyna takes care of the children and is trying to find a job, which is not easy in a frontline area. The family does not have their own home or close relatives who could support them in a difficult moment, and the earned money and child benefits are barely enough to cover their basic needs.

We helped the family purchase a supply of food and hygiene products, and buy new shoes for the children.

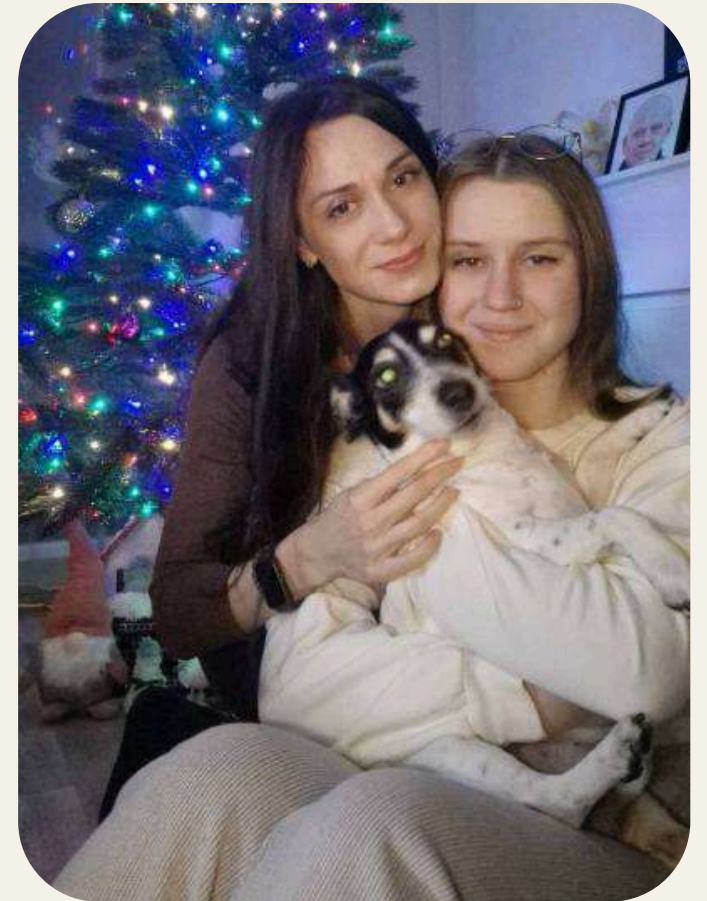
KATERYNA'S FAMILY FROM OBUKHIV

Kateryna is an internally displaced person from Kramatorsk. Last year, her husband died in her arms, and her teenage daughter began suffering from panic attacks. Kateryna is afraid to leave her child alone and works online, but she faces the risk of being laid off at any moment, as her work is connected to stores in frontline territories.

In the four years of the full-scale war, this family has lost their home and their normal life, and then Kateryna and her daughter lost their closest person. It is especially important for them not to lose their roof over their heads as well. We opened a fundraiser and sent the family funds for housing rent and utility bills to give them a bit more confidence in the future.

HELP FOR LIUBOV

Liubov is a 66-year-old internally displaced person from Popasna, Luhansk region. A missile hit her house—the roof and the fifth floor were destroyed, and all her belongings burned down. Since her evacuation, she has been living in a dormitory in Korsun-Shevchenkivskyi in central Ukraine. She cannot return home because her residence is completely destroyed and her hometown is under Russian occupation.

Due to the stress she endured, Liubov lost all her teeth, making it difficult for her to eat normal food—items have to be ground or finely chopped. Thanks to your support, we purchased a mini-fridge, an electric meat grinder, a coffee grinder, an electric kettle, a microwave, and a thermos for her. Now she can store products in her room, prepare soft meals, and heat up food in small portions.
