EMERGENCY AID IN KRYVYI RIH

€810

On July 30, a Russian ballistic missile hit a private house in the village of Radushne, near Kryvyi Rih. The large Voronov family lived there—six family members were killed. People in neighboring houses were also affected by the strike, but fortunately, they were saved: two boys, aged 6 and 15, were rescued from the rubble and hospitalized along with their mother.

Immediately after the strike, a rapid response crew—our long-term partners — deployed to the scene of the tragedy. These young volunteers assisted rescuers in clearing debris and rescuing people, and they provided first aid to the victims (for which they have undergone specialized training). They also boarded up shattered windows and doors in neighboring houses so that residents could remain there until full repairs could be made.

With your donations, we were able to purchase fuel for the team's work vehicle — this is exactly what allowed them to arrive quickly in Radushne, as well as at the sites of ten other strikes. We have opened a separate fundraiser to continue supporting the team and the affected residents of Kryvyi Rih:

HOT FOOD DELIVERY FOR PEOPLE AFFECTED BY SHELLING

€6,000

In July, there were 89 strikes in Kharkiv; our partners — the **ROKSANA AND THE TEAM** foundation — personally deployed to 33 of them, and for the rest, they provided food and drinks for victims, rescuers, and volunteers. Additionally, throughout the month, they fed people at evacuation hubs — a major evacuation from Bohodukhiv, Zolochiv, and Izyum in the Kharkiv region began in July, and the evacuation from Sumy and the Sumy region continued.

In total, the team prepared **47,000** portions of hot meals for those in need over the course of the month. We sent the foundation funds to purchase food supplies, disposable tableware, and to pay the rent for the kitchen facilities.

KHORUNZHIY FAMILY FROM VYSHNEVE €3,050

On the night of July 6, a Russian strike destroyed the Khorunzhyi family's home in Vyshneve, near Kyiv. The second floor and the roof were completely burned down — the house became uninhabitable. The family, who spent 15 years building it with their own hands, is now staying at their daughter's place.

We opened a separate fundraiser and raised 3,050 euros for the family — this will be enough for the initial emergency repairs: protecting the house from rain, reinforcing the walls, and beginning reconstruction. 1,780 euros of this was raised thanks to the viewers of the morning broadcast on the Dozhd (TV Rain) channel, where we appear every Tuesday.



I want to sincerely thank you and your entire team for such truly significant financial support. It is extremely important for us right now. And no less valuable was your care throughout our entire communication—the attention to our story, the interview you conducted, and the fact that you helped share our story more widely.

HELP TO A SHELTER FOR PEOPLE WITH LIMITED MOBILITY €3,003

66-year-old Nataliia and her 40-year-old daughter Iryna lived in Kozacha Lopan, Kharkiv region, and spent eight months under occupation. Due to a lack of treatment, Iryna's condition—she suffered from anemia—worsened significantly, and she stopped being able to walk on her own.

When the shelling intensified, Nataliia decided to evacuate. On June 22, she placed her daughter in an old baby stroller and walked with her for 17 kilometers to Slatyne, where they were helped to organize further evacuation. Iryna was taken to a hospital, and eventually, the mother and daughter arrived at our partners' shelter.

Now, Iryna's condition has improved, and she is already moving independently. The women remain in the shelter while awaiting further resettlement.

Thanks to your support, elderly people and those with limited mobility receive safe temporary housing and accompaniment on the path to a more stable life. In July, our partners were able to provide temporary housing for 11 people with limited mobility.

HELP TO A SHELTER FOR IDPS AND MOTHERS WITH CHILDREN IN KAMIANSKIE €1,770

Liudmyla is 23 years old and has a four-year-old daughter. The family used to live in Mykolaivka near Kamianske. Unfortunately, their home was completely destroyed during one of the shelling attacks, and her daughter was deeply traumatized by the experience. At that time, Liudmyla was told about our partners' shelter in Kamianske, and she decided to move there with her child.

Currently, Liudmyla is considering the possibility of moving to Denmark, but for now, she and her daughter remain in the shelter, where they feel calm and safe.

About 80 people are currently living in the shelter. In July, we purchased food for its residents for the following month, as well as fuel for evacuation trips to help more people leave frontline territories.

HELP TO A SHELTER IN THE DNIPROPETROVSK REGION €6,450 1/2

The photo shows Oleh, who is originally from Maryinka, Donetsk region. After the start of the full-scale invasion, the lives of this man and his wife turned into a struggle for survival. On August 3, 2022, the day of their planned evacuation, they came under fire: Oleh was wounded by a blast wave, and his wife was killed. Neighbors provided the man with first aid and took him to the hospital. As a result of his injuries, he suffered a severe concussion and underwent a leg amputation. The man never returned home — Maryinka was occupied by Russian troops.

Oleh was fortunate to receive prosthetics at the Dnipro branch of Superhumans, an all-Ukrainian military trauma center specializing in such care. There, Ukrainians affected by the war are not only fitted with free prostheses but also taught how to use them and provided with psychological support. At the center, Oleh learned about the shelter run by our partners, the **MOTIVATION TO LIVE** foundation (Motyvatsiia Zhyty). He is now continuing his recovery there and making plans for the future.

HELP TO A SHELTER IN THE DNIPROPETROVSK REGION €6,450 2/2

In July, your donations provided food and care for the shelter's residents and allowed the team to:

- take in new people after evacuation and hospital stays (there has been a particular increase in the number of evacuees from the Donetsk and Dnipropetrovsk regions);
- purchase additional phones, hygiene kits, storage boxes, and two wheelchairs for the new shelter residents;
- conduct training sessions in collaboration with partners to teach people new professions, enabling them to work and support themselves in the future;
- sign a memorandum with Superhumans — now they collaborate on joint housing for people undergoing prosthetics;
- organize regular visits by staff from the Administrative Services Center (TsNAP) directly to the shelter to process passports and other necessary documents (our ongoing fundraiser for document restoration continues; please support it at the link:).



There has been so much work these past weeks. We are at full capacity with 120 people, and 3 are currently in the hospital; after they are discharged, we won't even have a place to house them. Finding housing for people is very difficult. Resources for providing aid are becoming scarcer. We are doing everything in our power; thank you for your help and support. 🙏

VETERINARY MEDICATIONS FOR THE **€3,060** TREATMENT FOR A PET SHELTER IN KHARKIV

The photo shows a cat that, together with her kittens, was rescued by Ukrainian soldiers from a burning dugout near the front line. Her whiskers were slightly scorched, but fortunately, neither the cat nor the kittens sustained serious injuries. After the rescue, the military brought the whole furry family to our partners' shelter — the **ANIMAL CARE CENTER**, where animals can receive help and eventually find new loving families. The shelter's doctors have already carried out the necessary veterinary procedures and are monitoring the cats' condition.

In July, the **KHARKIV CITY PET SHELTER** took in 119 dogs and 67 cats. Veterinarians sterilized 149 animals; 92 animals found a new home or were placed under the care of public organizations. Currently, the shelter is caring for 418 dogs and cats. Your donations provided veterinary medications for their treatment and parasite prevention.

FOOD, CAT LITTER, AND RENT FOR A SHELTER FOR EVACUATED PETS €3,430

The photo shows chinchillas that were brought along with a parrot from Druzhkivka, Donetsk region, to the shelter of our Kharkiv partners — the organization **ANIMAL GUARDIANS**. What happened to the animals' owners is unknown. Unfortunately, five days after the evacuation, the parrot died (most likely due to stress), but the chinchillas' condition is stable. One of them has already gone to a new family, while the second remains under observation for now and will soon be looking for a home as well.

In total, the organization's shelter is home to 137 cats, 12 dogs, and now a chinchilla. Thanks to you, in July the team was able to:

- purchase food, cat litter, and household supplies;
- pay the rent, utilities, and the salary of the staff member who cares for the animals;
- purchase medications and pay for the pets' medical treatment.

DISPLACED FAMILY FROM SHAKHTARSKE €500

In early February, a Russian strike destroyed a three-story building in the city of Shakhtarske, Dnipropetrovsk region. A family of seven displaced persons and a pensioner, Nataliia, with her dog, were left without a home. All members of the large family suffered severe burns and require rehabilitation.

We opened a separate fundraiser for the victims and in May transferred the collected funds to them for housing rent, recovery from injuries, and the purchase of essentials and household appliances. In July, we sent additional funds from the reserve fund to the displaced family, as they still need support to get back on their feet after what happened.

The guys are all very grateful. This is such massive support. People didn't expect this; they had resigned themselves to the idea that they were needed by no one here. But thanks to you, they have found faith. 🙏🙏🙏

LILIA'S FAMILY FROM KAMIANSKIE

Lilia and her sons (aged 20 and 13) are displaced persons from the town of Shakhtarske, Dnipropetrovsk region. Lilia's husband died of cancer a month and a half ago; after that, the family finally decided to leave, as the town was being shelled more and more heavily. Lilia has multiple sclerosis, and she was left alone with her sons.

The family moved to Kamianske, Dnipropetrovsk region, and found a temporary home in our partners' shelter. Lilia has already found a job as a supermarket cashier, applied for IDP (Internally Displaced Person) payments for the family, and found a permanent housing option, but it is difficult for the family to move there as they need to pay the first month's rent and a security deposit upfront.

We sent the family money for three months' rent to give them time to get on their feet in the new city.

KARINA'S FAMILY FROM THE CHERNIVTSI REGION €300

Karina is a 21-year-old single mother from Marivka, Zaporizhzhia region, who left there this summer with her 3-month-old daughter for the Chernivtsi region to stay with her mother-in-law, with almost no belongings. She is no longer with her husband, and her mother, grandmother, younger brothers, and sister are unable to help her, as they were also forced to leave their native village and are trying to get on their feet in Zaporizhzhia. Karina lives on IDP (Internally Displaced Person) payments and child benefits, but this is not enough to cover even basic expenses.

We sent Karina one-time assistance for food, clothing, and shoes for the child, as well as a crib, to slightly improve their daily life.

OLENA'S FAMILY FROM TERNIVKA

Olena's family was forced to leave their hometown of Selydove, Donetsk region, in 2024. Currently, they live in the city of Ternivka, Dnipropetrovsk region.

Olena's husband, Oleksandr, works as a rescuer in the mine rescue service, while she takes care of the children; there are three in the family: 15-year-old twin sons and an 8-month-old daughter. The husband's salary is 275 euros, and all state payments for internally displaced persons go toward paying for their housing rent. The family is barely making ends meet. We sent them money to purchase food, a supply of medicine, and clothing for the children.

I am so, so grateful to you. Now is the most difficult time. Everyone has fallen ill, there is no money. You are our salvation.

IRYNA FROM KAMIANSKE

Iryna is originally from the Luhansk region; she left there on the first day of the full-scale invasion. Currently, the woman lives in the city of Kamianske, Dnipropetrovsk region, and works as a civil servant. Her native village is temporarily occupied.

During her time in Kamianske, Iryna and other temporarily displaced people have been moved from one dormitory to another four times already. At the moment, she lives in a shelter for free, but the contract with this shelter is for only six months. After that, another move awaits her. Iryna does not receive state payments because she has a job, but her salary is not enough for housing rent and other expenses. Iryna's relatives are also displaced persons who are scattered across the country and do not have the opportunity to help her financially.

We sent the woman money to purchase a small refrigerator, a power bank, and food to slightly improve her daily life.

YANA'S FAMILY FROM KAMIANSKE

In July, Yana from Kamianske reached out to us for help again. Yana's family are internally displaced persons from Shakhtarske, Dnipropetrovsk region. Yana is a volunteer raising a one-year-old daughter, and her husband, Yurii, also volunteers and works in pest control. In the winter of 2026, as part of the "Warm Fundraiser," we helped the family purchase a portable power station so they could stay connected, charge their gadgets, and have some light during long blackouts caused by shelling of the infrastructure.

In July, Yana wrote to us again — she developed complications after a hysteroscopy, and the treatment required a significant amount of money. As a result, they temporarily had no money left for rent. We sent the family funds to cover their rent and utility bills for two months, allowing the woman to focus on recovering her health.
