DELIVERY OF HOT MEALS TO PEOPLE AFFECTED BY SHELLING

€4,600

October was a tough month for Kharkiv: relentless shelling gave residents no respite, and air raid sirens blared for more than 300 hours.

Thanks to your support, "Let's Help's" long-standing partner, the "Roxana and the Team" foundation, was able to respond to impact sites 12 times throughout the month. There, they distributed approximately 5,000 sandwiches and 7,000 hot meals. A cup of tea, a bottle of water, a bowl of soup — seemingly simple things, but they give victims a sense of not being alone and provide volunteers and rescuers the strength to continue helping for as long as it takes.

The foundation's team also continued supporting the evacuation headquarters by supplying hot meals and snacks to people evacuated from frontline villages and towns in the Kharkiv region.



PURCHASING VACCINES FOR ANIMALS AND CLOTHING FOR SHELTER STAFF IN KHARKIV

In October, the "Animal Care Center" provided refuge to 196 dogs and cats. Most of the animals came from the Kupiansk and Vovchansk communities along with evacuees from these areas. Some pets were temporarily left at the shelter while their owners search for housing. Twenty-six animals ended up at the shelter due to the death of their owners.

The shelter is actively preparing for winter: the roof replacement in the enclosures is nearing completion, and the dog kennels are being insulated with warm items brought by Kharkiv residents.

Thanks to your support, in October the shelter's veterinarians will be able to vaccinate 510 animals, and nine animal care workers will be provided with winter workwear and footwear. In the photo is Ryzhunchik, a dog from Donetsk region and a favorite of the shelter staff. The dog arrived with an injured leg, which, unfortunately, had to be amputated. But that didn't stop Ryzhunchik from finding a home! The dog was adopted by a woman who had already adopted two dogs and a cat from the shelter in 2018.

SHELTER IN DNIPRO AND HELP FOR A FAMILY FROM KURAKHOVE 10,950

In October, we once again supported the shelter of our partners, the Children New Generation foundation. Currently, 98 people are living there, and another 88 transit residents passed through the shelter over the month. This month, we not only helped cover the shelter's rent and provided its residents with essentials (food, hygiene products, and clothing), but also offered targeted assistance to one of the families cared for by Children New Generation.

In the photo is Valentyna (in the blue jacket). She sustained serious injuries from an airstrike on the Cultural House in Kurakhove and was transported in critical condition to a hospital in Dnipro. Valentyna's husband and children relocated to the village of Volosske, where the family is trying to rebuild their lives, but they lack the resources for even basic trips to the hospital. We assisted them by purchasing essential items, food, and firewood.





SHELTER IN THE DNOPROPETROVSK REGION

€6,907

The shelter in Dnipropetrovsk region continues to welcome evacuees from frontline areas, providing them with shelter and essential items.

Thanks to the support provided through "Let's Help," in October, a water heater was installed in the shelter, which was crucial as the weather turned colder. A large quantity of hygiene products, medicines, food, as well as clothing and footwear for those who lost everything, were purchased. Additionally, door handles were bought to provide residents with some personal space.

In the photo are Viktor and his mother, the shelter's new residents. They will never return home: their house was destroyed, and the town of Hirnyk is now occupied. Viktor is genuinely happy with his new pair of winter boots, while his mother enjoys the sunny weather and the chance to read a book outdoors. Simple care and involvement make a difference for people like them. Your support, alongside ours, gives hope to those who have lost everything due to the war.



EVACUATING PEOPLE WITH LIMITED MOBILITY FROM OCCUPIED AND FRONTLINE TERRITORIES

In September and October, the volunteer team organized the evacuation of 35 people, including 25 women and 10 men. Among them, 20 people had limited mobility, and one person was immobile.

The organization develops evacuation routes and provides informational and financial assistance to help Ukrainians from occupied and frontline areas, as well as those deported to Russia, to reach safe locations.

Currently, the Volyn Humanitarian Corridor remains the only route for people from temporarily occupied territories to government-controlled areas of Ukraine. Unfortunately, evacuation transport is not provided for evacuees after crossing the border and arriving in Volyn. To support them, we provided 94 people with public transport tickets to help them reach their intended destinations.



HUMANITARIAN AID FOR RESIDENTS OF KHERSON AND MYKOLAIV REGIONS

Last month, volunteers distributed 300 sets (food and hygiene products) in two villages in Kherson region. An additional 294 sets were given to residents of four villages in Mykolaiv region, and 400 sets were provided to displaced persons in Mykolaiv. Additionally, volunteers sent 100 hygiene kits to Kherson, including for people with limited mobility.







DELIVERY OF ANIMAL FEED TO UKRAINE 6000

We support a volunteer organization in Sweden that collects food, medicines, and care products for cats and dogs in Ukraine. This assistance is directed to animals from small private shelters in Ukraine and those living with local volunteers.

Thanks to your donations, in October, more than 1,200 kilograms of food were delivered to 22 volunteer organizations and 14 shelters in various cities across Ukraine.



EVACUATION FROM OCCUPIED TERRITORIES £2,500

In October, we began collaborating with another organization that focuses on the evacuation of civilians from occupied territories. The main goal of our partners is to help people safely reach Ukrainian-controlled areas or the EU. The evacuation takes place from the occupied parts of eastern Ukraine — Zaporizhzhia and Kherson regions.

Thanks to your donations, our partners will be able to evacuate 17 people from several cities. All of them will then travel to EU countries. Some are going to reunite with their families, while for others, this will be their second or third attempt to leave the occupied zone after previous failed attempts.

REPAIRING A VEHICLE FOR EVACUATION AND ASSISTING TIGRAN'S MOTHER £2,000

The volunteer organization "Rose on the Hand" was established in 2019 to search for missing people, and after the full-scale invasion, it began evacuating people from frontline areas. Each such trip is a great risk for all participants: the evacuees, drivers, and volunteers. However, not going would mean leaving people in partially destroyed houses, injured, vulnerable, and under shelling.

Unfortunately, one of the evacuation missions in October ended in tragedy for the organization and the entire volunteer community. During an evacuation from the Pokrovsk district, a drone hit the bus carrying the volunteers. Tigran Galustyan, a Kharkiv resident from "Rose on the Hand," who had saved many lives during evacuation missions, was seriously wounded and passed away on the way to the hospital. Many of our partners worked with Tigran and knew him. He is survived by his mother and young daughter, whom he raised alone. We helped "Rose on the Hand" with vehicle repairs for evacuation and also sent financial assistance to Tigran's mother.



SERHII FROM KHERSON (£201)

We continue to support Serhii from Kherson, whose home was damaged by shelling twice: in July and September 2024. During the second shelling, he was at home. He survived, but it was no longer possible to live in the house, so Serhii had to evacuate. After such a traumatic experience, he suffered a heart attack and ended up in the hospital, without a home and uncertain about what to do next.

We helped Serhii pay for a new month's rent for a mobile home in Uzhhorod. There, he can be close to his daughter, who also lost her home during the shelling and is currently living in a dormitory for displaced people.



ALIONA FROM CHERNIHIV (£221)

Aliona is a single mother from Chernihiv. Her husband passed away in July 2022, and since then, she has been raising their teenage son on her own.

Her salary as a city water utility worker barely covers their basic needs, and the situation in the city only adds to unplanned expenses: during a shelling, the windows in their house were blown out, and she had to urgently replace them.

We helped Aliona with purchasing winter clothing, food, and hygiene products.




VOLODYMYR FROM KHARKIV (561)

Volodymyr lost his son Mark in a shelling of their home in Kharkiv. His wife, Tetiana, is in the hospital in critical condition. Their nephew, Nazar, survived but has a severe leg injury.

Volodymyr buried his son alone because his wife is still in the hospital. He is now living with friends and visits his wife at the intensive care unit every day.

Tetiana has a serious spinal injury; one of her vertebrae is completely missing, as it was shattered. We have already helped the family order the necessary implant, and once Tetiana's condition stabilizes, doctors will be able to perform the surgery to insert it. After the surgery, the family will need financial support for her rehabilitation and basic needs, as they lost everything, including their documents, in the shelling.
