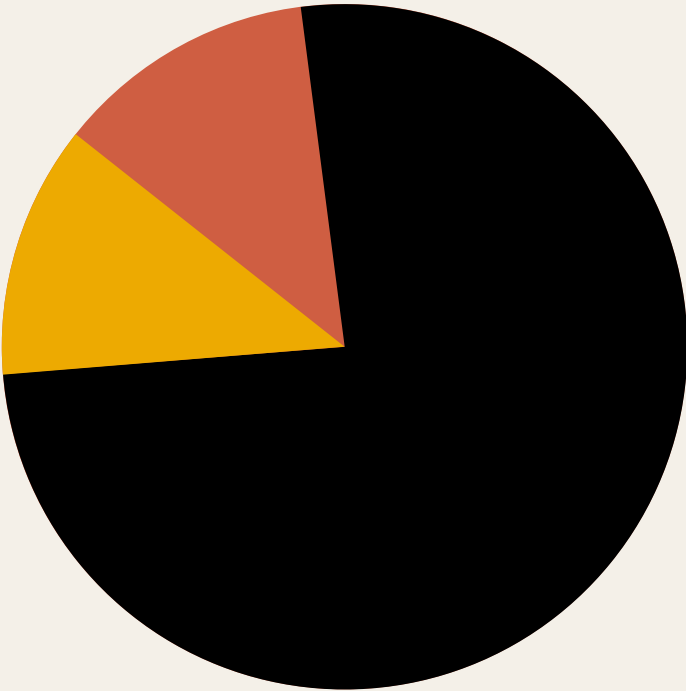

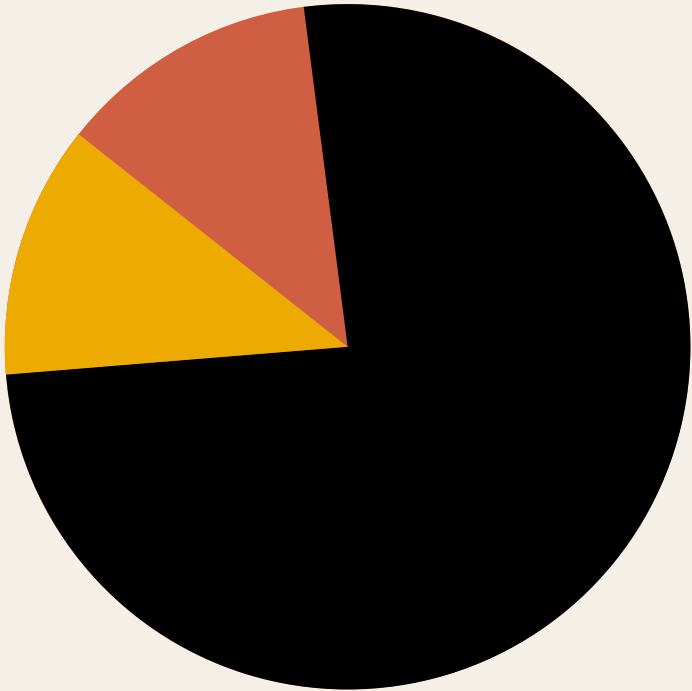

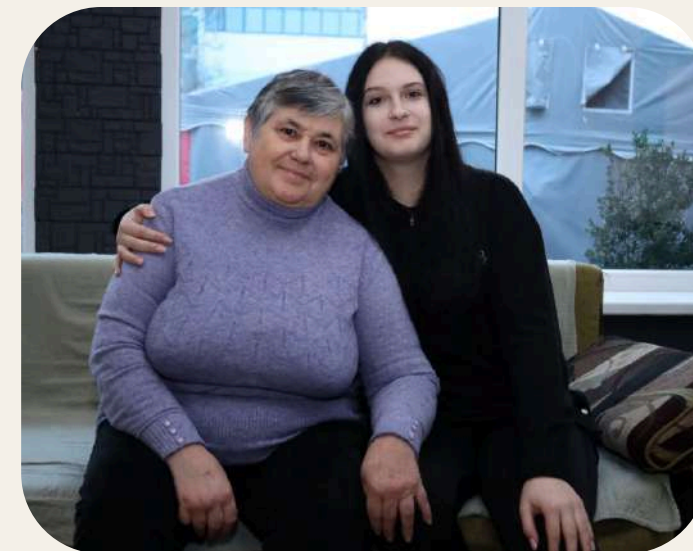
# SUPPORT FOR TWO SHELTERS IN DNIPRO

€4,518

75-year-old Alla Ponomareva and her 15-year-old granddaughter Viktoria lived in the Donetsk region. Alla lived alone, and Viktoria lived with her mother in a neighboring village. When the front line began rapidly approaching their homes, the mother and daughter left for our partners' shelter — the **CHILDREN NEW GENERATION** foundation.

Some time later, Viktoria called her grandmother, told her that her mother had abandoned her, and asked Alla to come to her. Four days later, the front line reached Alla's village. When volunteers arrived to evacuate her, drones were circling above her house. Alla was first evacuated to Pavlohrad and then to Dnipro, where Viktoria was waiting for her. Now grandmother and granddaughter are together again.

In November, 178 people were evacuated from frontline areas of the Dnipropetrovsk region to the two CNG shelters. Even amid the constant shelling, the team worked to maintain a calm atmosphere in the shelters. Staff paid special attention to families with children. Additionally, the facilities were winterized over the course of the month. Your donations help cover the rent, utilities, food, medicine, and essentials for the residents.

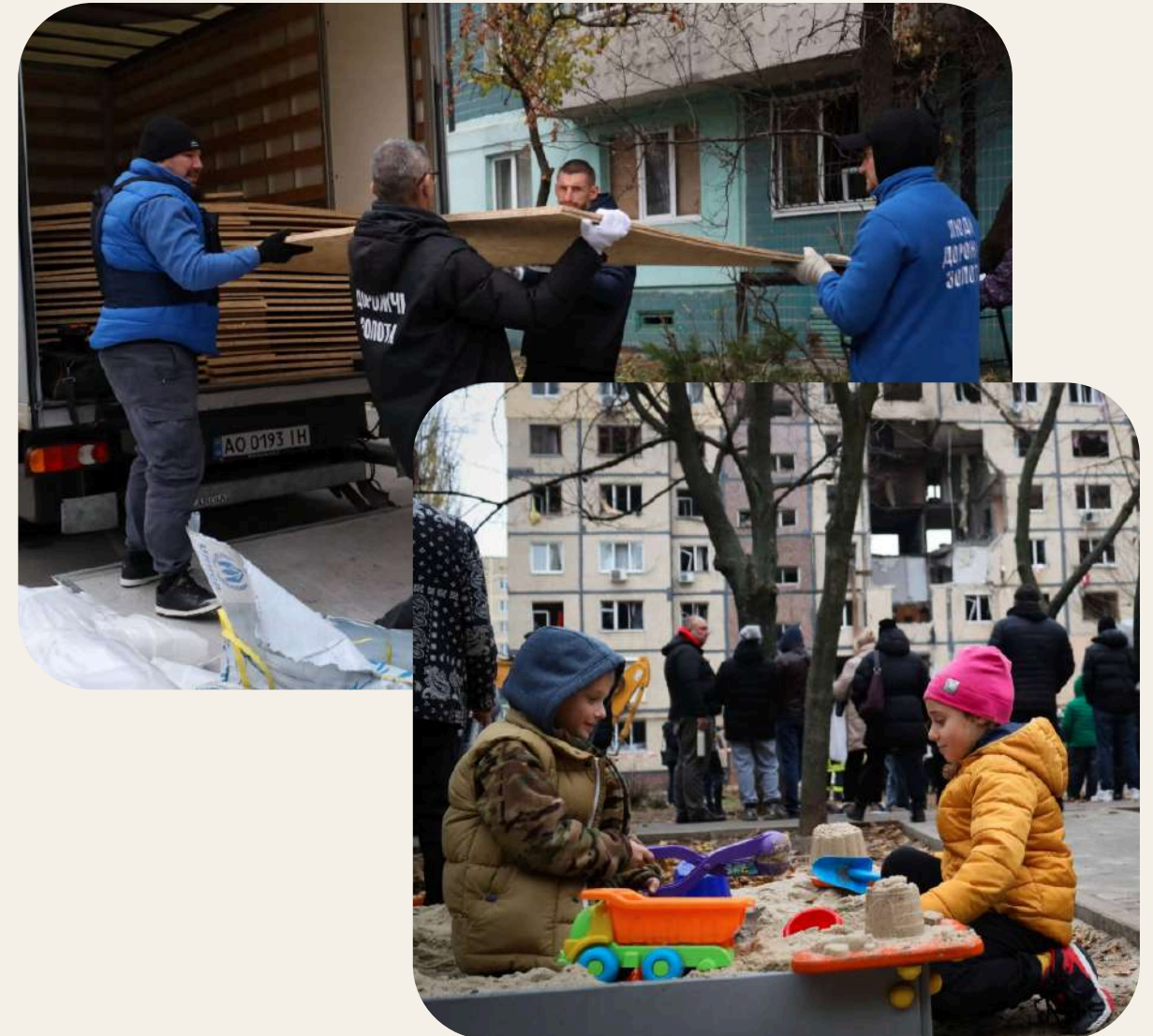

# EMERGENCY AID IN DNIPRO €2,000

Throughout November, Russian forces constantly attacked Dnipro. On November 8, a drone struck a nine-story residential building. Eleven people were injured, and one woman was killed.

Our partners — the **CHILDREN NEW GENERATION** foundation team — spent the entire night at the strike site alongside emergency services. Foundation staff supported people by distributing water, hot tea and coffee, blankets, power banks, and helping to board up blown-out windows.

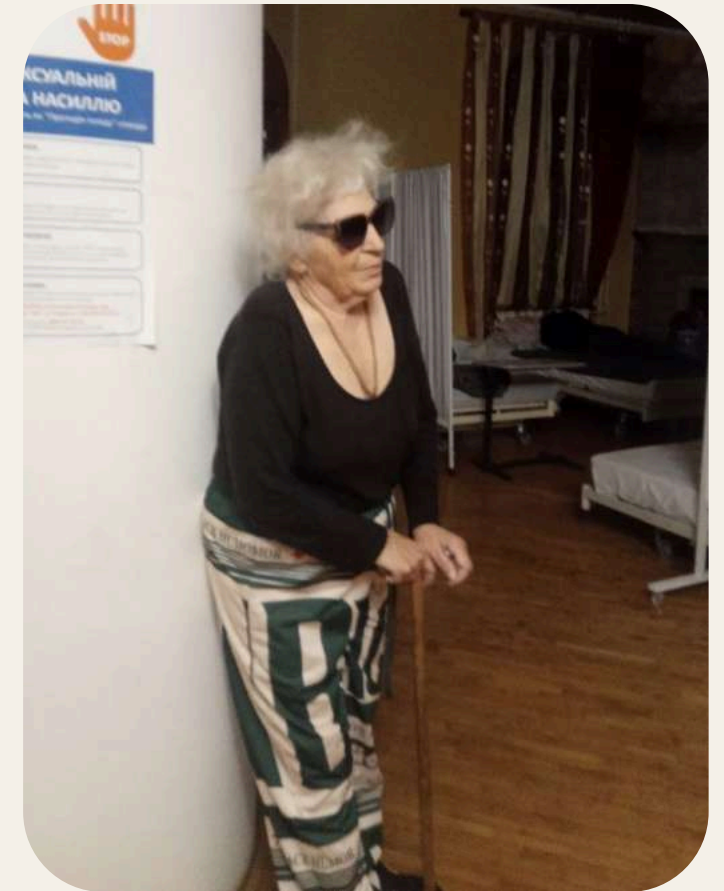

# SUPPORT FOR A SHELTER FOR PEOPLE WITH LIMITED MOBILITY €2,500

Tetiana Oleksandrivna from Kupiansk completely lost her sight in 2024 and had been living with her daughter since then. They managed the household together, supporting each other. Tetiana's daughter sustained deep wounds to her arms, legs, and abdomen when their home was struck by guided bombs. Tetiana Oleksandrivna found her daughter by touch, gave her first aid, then gathered their things for the hospital. Neighbors took the women to a hospital in Kharkiv. Tetiana was then taken to our partners' shelter, where she is waiting for her daughter to recover from her injuries. Ahead lies the search for safe housing where they can start a new chapter of their lives together.

The specially equipped shelter provides housing for elderly, bedridden, and mobility-impaired residents of the Kharkiv region. Our partners evacuate people from frontline areas and care for them, providing medical and psychological support. Your donations ensure the stable operation of the shelter and its team.

# SUPPORT FOR A SHELTER FOR IDPs AND MOTHERS WITH CHILDREN IN KAMIANSKIE

Yuliia is a single mother from the Donetsk region. Her home was destroyed by the war. She and her two sons have been living for nearly a year at our partners' shelter in Kamianske, Dnipropetrovsk region.

The shelter takes in those who have nowhere else to go. People who have lost their homes because of the war find refuge here, as do mothers with children in difficult situations. Around 35 people live there permanently.

Unfortunately, residents also face food shortages. The shelter doesn't have enough money for groceries, and local farmers and volunteer organizations aren't always able to help. In November, we helped the team purchase food for a month.

Thanks to your support, the shelter residents won't go hungry.

# AID FOR AN IDP SHELTER IN THE DNIPROPETROVSK REGION

€4,000

In the photo are Oleksiyivna and Pavlivna, as they're called at the shelter. Both are from the Donetsk region, and both worked all their lives, but because of the war, they were left with nothing in their old age. The women found shelter and care at our partners' facility — the **MOTIVATION TO LIVE** foundation.

Besides Oleksiyivna and Pavlivna, around 110 people live here. Another 20 find temporary refuge here each month. In November, your donations helped the team:

- organize a trip to the pension fund to help people apply for their pensions;
- bring in hairdressers for elderly residents with limited mobility;
- arrange regular visits from a rehabilitation specialist who teaches people with amputations how to walk with prosthetics;
- complete the renovation of eight modular houses on the shelter grounds, which can accommodate up to 40 people;
- relocate a family from Zaporizhzhia to rented housing and help a family from Kurakhove move to Switzerland;
- purchase hygiene products, medicine, food, and clothing for residents.

# EVACUATING PEOPLE WITH LIMITED MOBILITY FROM OCCUPIED AND FRONTLINE AREAS

€3,000

84-year-old Iryna (name changed) lived alone in the Donetsk region. Her daughter had been living in Ireland since the start of the full-scale invasion and wanted to bring her mother to safety, but didn't know how. Iryna can only walk short distances on her own. She doesn't know how to use a phone and could only contact relatives through an acquaintance — but he recently left the city. For some time, her relatives completely lost contact with her.

Ukrainian partners of **LET'S HELP** assisted in evacuating the woman. The family reunited in Ukrainian-controlled territory, and now Iryna is with her daughter.

Our anonymous partners rescue Ukrainians from frontline zones and occupied areas. **LET'S HELP** supports them in evacuating elderly and mobility-impaired people. Our partners develop evacuation routes, prepare people for the journey, and find escorts to help them cross borders. Thanks to your support, the team evacuated 12 people in November.

# DELIVERY OF HOT MEALS TO PEOPLE AFFECTED BY SHELLING €3,500

In November, our longtime partners — the Kharkiv-based **ROKSANA AND THE TEAM** foundation — prepared and distributed 16,000 sandwiches, 29,550 hot meals, drinks, and sweets for displaced Kharkiv residents, those affected by shelling, volunteers, rescuers, children with limited mobility, and people left without electricity, heating, or water due to attacks. Together, we sent the foundation money to purchase food, disposable tableware for a month, and to cover rent for their cooking facility.

But that's not all! Recently, the foundation staff visited an orphanage in Krasnokutsk. There, in family-style homes, live orphans and children with mental disabilities or cerebral palsy. Each family has between 10 and 16 children. Roksana and her team treated the children to sweets and fruit, cooked pilaf over a fire, and entertained them. The foundation also brought gifts for the families: toys, school supplies, and household products — things the children wanted and their caregivers requested. In total, **ROKSANA AND THE TEAM** brought joy to 24 families and over 200 children. This celebration happened thanks to your donations.

# TREATMENTS AND MEDICATIONS FOR ANIMALS AT THE KHARKIV SHELTER

€2,100

A kitten named Malyshka ("Little One") was found on the street by people who, seeing that the animal urgently needed veterinary care, took her to a nearby clinic. The price they quoted was unaffordable. So Malyshka was taken to the Kharkiv City Shelter. Thanks to **LET'S HELP**'s ongoing support, the team was able to perform the necessary surgery for free. Malyshka is now recovering and will soon be ready to go to a loving family.

In November, the **KHARKIV CITY PET SHELTER** took in 188 animals — 155 dogs and 33 cats. Veterinarians sterilized 190 animals, and 81 animals found new homes or were taken in by public organizations. The shelter currently cares for 467 animals — 403 dogs and 64 cats. Together, we helped the team purchase anti-parasitic treatments and veterinary medications for the animals.

The kittens in the top photo are Pusha and Businka. They were evacuated with their mother from the Liptsy area. The animals were found in a destroyed house. At the time of evacuation, the kittens were tiny. The cat family was taken in by our partners — the **ANIMAL GUARDIANS UA** foundation. Under the organization's care, Pusha and Businka grew up and soon found wonderful families. But their mother, Abrikoska (in the bottom photo), is still waiting for a loving home. The foundation's shelter currently houses 135 cats and 13 dogs.

With our help this month, the team was able to:

- purchase food and litter for the animals;
- pay rent for the facility and utilities.

In 2022, they left Velyka Novosilka in the Donetsk region for Vasylkivka in the Dnipropetrovsk region. In 2025, they had to leave there as well. The family now lives with relatives in Kamianske, Dnipropetrovsk region.

In 2022, Valentyna was going down to a basement to take shelter from shelling when she fell and injured her leg. In 2025, she was in an accident that worsened her condition. Valentyna had to have surgery and now needs ongoing rehabilitation.

We sent the family money to purchase food, hygiene products, and medications for Valentyna.

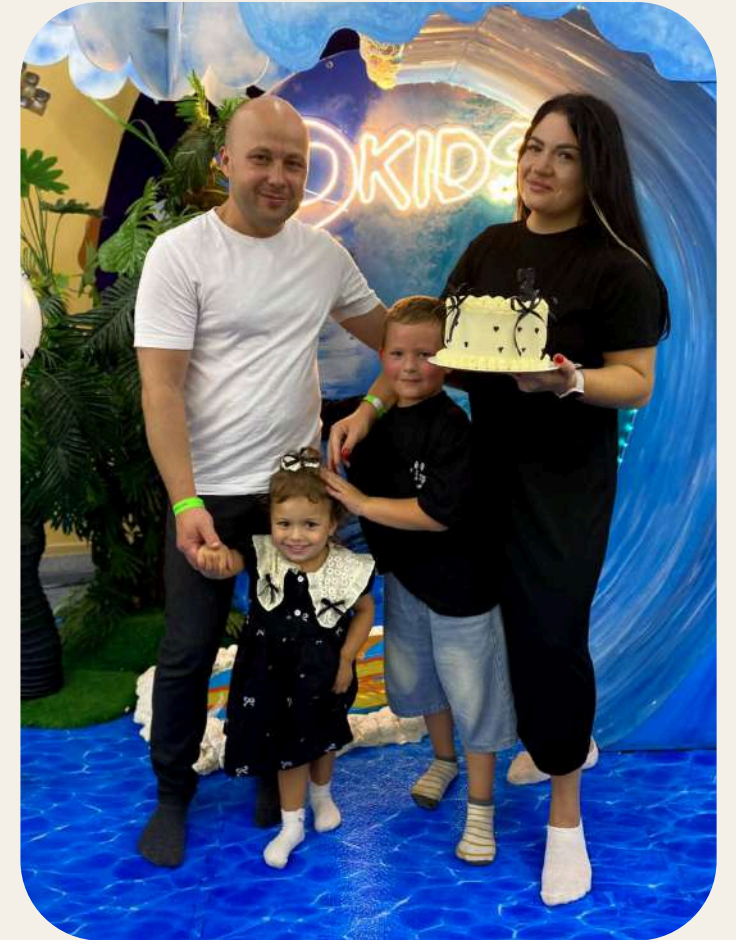

Anna and her family — two young children, her grandmother, and their cat Bonia — are internally displaced from Selidove. Since 2022, they've been living in Kamianske. Anna's husband stayed behind as long as he could to keep his job, but in October this year, he also left for Kamianske.

Anna worked as an elementary school teacher, but there are no more vacancies in local schools. Her husband was a miner in Selidove, but after relocating, he also lost his job.

We sent the family money to cover two months' rent, giving them time to get back on their feet without fear of losing their home.

Iryna lives alone in a dorm room in Latvia. Recently, she caught a virus that worsened her asthma. The illness prevents Iryna from working, which means she has no way to pay for housing. We've helped her cover the cost of her dorm room several times before, and in November, we once again paid for her monthly rent and utility bills.

Recently, Iryna needed to get a new passport. In her case, she can't do this in Riga, and without valid documents, she won't be able to renew her residency permit. We sent her money to get a passport in Warsaw. Now Iryna and her cat won't lose their home.
